Swimming lessons

Dear Parents/Carers,

Firstly, thank you to all of our pupils who have attended our swimming classes at Saltash Leisure Centre since the start of this new academic year. Since returning in September, our KS2 pupils have been attending regular swimming classes as part of their physical education development. In addition, our Early Years, KS1, KS3 and KS4 pupils have attended bespoke Swimming Experiences built upon teaching them essential lifesaving skills. As well as fulfilling the National Curriculum requirements, we have witnessed Fountain Head House School pupils achieve a number of sporting and personal achievements, including some of our pupils swimming independently for the very first time. Following our return to school after the autumn break I sat down with some of our pupils and reflected on their experiences so far:

"I was able to swim the length of the pool (25m) by myself" (Pupil from Year 5);

"I learnt how to be safe around the pool" (Pupil from Year

"I loved swimming through the hoops under the water and jumping in from the side of the pool" (Pupil from Year 6);


"I can now kick with my legs straight" (Pupil from Year 3).
