Dear Parents & Carers,

Following on from the December edition of this newsletter, I am very pleased to confirm that the funds raised at the Christmas Fair were as follows:

Therapy Dogs: £74.18 – this money was raised by one pupil who ran his own mini-enterprise stall at the Christmas Fair. This pupil loves animals and has benefited from the Assistance Dogs Charity himself. This is a great achievement and we feel very proud of this pupil's initiative.

Air Ambulance: £206.70 – this was inspired by the video appeal released by the Cornwall Air Ambulance just before Christmas. This money was raised through our raffle and 'guess the weight of the cake'. We would like to thank the School Board and OPUS recruitment who provided lovely raffle prizes for the Christmas Fair.

Children's Hospice SW was £263.81 – these funds were raised by the Secondary pupils who made lovely Christmas items to sell at the fair, including Christmas decorations and Christmas cards. It is great to see our young people engaging in projects to help others in need



Earlier in the term we also raised £39.50 for Children In Need. This was part of our fun Children in Need day and the sale of cakes and biscuits made by the pupils.

Afternoon Tea event

As part of our aim to build a strong School Community, we are introducing this half- term our first Afternoon Tea.

The Afternoon Tea sessions are similar to our monthly Coffee mornings with the difference that we will include a short presentation on a topic of interest, and parents/carers will have the opportunity to have a conversation about it.

Our first Afternoon Tea will take place on **Wednesday**, **8th February 2023 from 14:00 to 15:00**. We have invited one of our parents to share her knowledge and experience of **PACE (Playfulness Acceptance Curiosity Empathy)**.

Information about the topic:

"Often we can be frustrated by our children's actions and frequently people around us do not always understand how we live or why our children have some of their behaviours. I'm a Mum of one of FHH's students and since my family were young, I learnt how to use PACE in parenting and saw the benefits. I've been asked to share what this looks like and how it can help. This isn't a lecture on parenting at all, it's just me sharing what has worked for us!"

PACE is a way of thinking, feeling, communicating and behaving that aims to make the child feel safe. Using PACE helps adults to slow down their reactions, stay calm and tune into what the child is experiencing in the moment. It supports us to gain a better understanding of what the child is feeling. In tricky moments it allows us to stay emotionally regulated and guide the child through their heightened emotions, thoughts and behaviours. In turn, PACE helps children and young people to feel more connected to and understood by

important adults in their life and ultimately, to slow down their own responses.

We look forward to seeing you at this next event.



Online safety

Each term, we will share with you some advice to support your child in keeping themselves safe. This term's focus is about online safety with a focus on 'Parental Controls', which are an important feature as we have just had the holiday period when children may have received games consoles and spending more of their leisure time online.

Setting up devices with parental controls, in relation to the age of your child, is a useful intervention to support them with feeling safe online.


Introducing Evisense
